EPM Equine Protozoal Myeloencephalitis is a neurological disease caused by a parasite, Sarcocystis neuronal, that attacks the horse's brain and spinal cord. EPM causes serious damage to a horse's central nervous system and can be fatal. Opossums are the primary parasite hosts.

Neurological Disorder/Equine Protozoal Myeloencephalitis ...

Equine Protozoal Myeloencephalitis (EPM) EPM is caused by a protozoan parasite, Sarcocystis neurona, that invades the central nervous system. Clinical signs vary, but usually symptoms are associated with the spinal cord: incoordination, stumbling, weakness. Muscle wasting along the topline and haunches is also common.

For the most part, neurological gait abnormalities involve degrees of paresis (weakness) and ataxia - the degree of each should be evaluated (mild, moderate, severe for paresis, 0 to 4+ for ataxia).
